Date Confirmed for Ironbridge Power Station's Boiler Bay Demolition



Harworth Group plc ('Harworth'), a leading regenerator of land and property for development and investment, can confirm that the demolition of the former Ironbridge Power Station's Boiler Bay is scheduled for between **10am and 2pm on Saturday 27th February 2021**.

It is important to note that while the demolition is planned for this date and time, there may be adverse weather conditions or other circumstances that could cause a delay or possible postponement of the demolition. Should this be the case, Harworth will issue further statements to advise on its timetable.

Harworth's principal concern is to bring the Boiler Bay down safely, in full compliance with Covid-19 restrictions and the Section 81 notice issued by Shropshire Council for this purpose.

To protect everyone on site and in the local area a 250m safety exclusion zone will be in place shortly before, during and for a period after the explosion to which there will be no public access. Details of this zone are provided on the ironbridgeregeneration.co.uk website. The blowdown will not need any major road closures.

In addition, the blowdown of the Boiler Bay will generate dust. The vast majority of dust generated by the blowdown will fall within the Boiler Bay's immediate vicinity. There remains the possibility however that some dust will be carried beyond the 250m exclusion zone. Therefore, any local residents with respiratory conditions are advised to stay indoors during and immediately after the demolition takes place.

Updates in the run up to and after the demolition will be put on the Ironbridge regeneration website as well as being shared with local media. Local people and businesses are thanked for their co-operation and patience through this process.
